## ParentLink at Goshen Elementary:

You will receive calls from Parent Link (an automated system) on daily attendance calls. This call will be made on the morning your child has been marked absent by their teacher. This will happen if you have not called the school before 9:30 to excuse your student. Please continue to call the school to excuse all absences or tardies. This system will also be used in the future to inform parents about important information and announcements, such as snow days. If you have any questions about this system, please contact the school. **PLEASE** make sure that your contact information is up- to- date on SIS. This is the information that will be used to make contact with you and your family. If you do not have a **current email address** listed on your contact information, please include one. We have been sending out important updated information by email to our parents. You can also check the school calendar for Goshen School on the Nebo website. This will give you information about what is happening at our school.

### **Note from the School Nurse:**

Cold and flu result in more absences in school age children than almost any other illness. Most colds and flu are caused by viruses. Viral infections cannot be helped by penicillin or other antibiotics. If the child has a fever or cannot do their class work they should not be in school. See your health care provider if the cold is accompanied by the signs of a bacterial infection, such as persistent cough or a cough that produces yellow or green phlegm, high fever (100 degrees or above), pain in the ears, sinus or chest, or severe sore throat. Bacterial infections can be treated with antibiotics.

This is a list of suggestions that may be helpful for you if your child is suffering from cold or flu:

- . Get plenty of rest. If he/she is having difficulty breathing because of congestion, you can try having them sleep propped up with pillows.
- . Drink plenty of fluids (hot or cold).
- . <u>Frequent hand washing to prevent the spread of germs</u>. <u>Dispose of tissues carefully</u>.
- . Clean contaminated household objects (i.e. phones and toys) frequently. Wash dishes in hot soapy water.
- . Try to have your child keep his/her hands away from his/her face.
- . Using a vaporizer or humidifier may help with congestion.
- . Eat when hungry.
- . Parents can consider using a decongestant, pain relievers to relieve the symptoms of cold and flu as directed by your health care provider or pharmacist.

\*\*\*During the flu season, please keep children at home if they have a fever, body aches, or a cough. They must be free from the fever and body aches for 24 hours before they can return. We realize the cough may linger longer, but should not be accompanied by the fever and body aches before they return.



#### Read To Succeed

Tips for reading aloud Reading connection

Why is reading aloud to your children the number one suggestion from reading experts across the country? It has the greatest academic benefit and builds the desire to read in only 15 or 20 minutes a day! Whether your youngsters are already reading on their own or haven't yet begun, now is the perfect time for reading aloud regularly. Here are a few tips to help you get the most out of your time together.

#### **Remove distractions**

Make your reading spot as quiet as possible so your youngsters can focus on the story. Turn off the television and consider ignoring the phone to avoid interruptions.

### **Encourage participation**

Children are apt to enjoy reading more when they're invited to join in. Let them take turns choosing a book and turning the pages. If there's repetition in a story challenge them to recite the key phrases with you.

#### Keep it appropriate

If your kids have trouble following the language or plot of a story it may be too difficult for them. Look for books that are closer to their reading levels. Tip: Ask your children's teachers for suggestions.

#### **Ask Questions**

Check for understanding and help build comprehension by asking several questions about what you've read.

Most of all enjoy the time together and rest assured your making positive memories that only cost time.
